Ideal climate, flavour filled wines ...

The great winemaking region of Langhorne Creek is less than an hour's drive from Adelaide. Langhorne Creek is traditionally a red wine grape region best known for its full bodied Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz. We have a surprisingly cool climate that also allows production of exceptionally flavoured white and fortified wines.

The original vineyards adjacent to the Bremer River experience natural floods from rain that falls in the Adelaide Hills. The soils are deep alluvial sandy loams, which receive a deposit of silts and nutrients with each flood.

Langhorne Creek labelled wines enjoy success locally, nationally and in the competitive world export market.

As old as our pioneers, as young as the exciting new generation of winemakers...

The name 'Langhorne Creek' acknowledges Alfred Langhorne, a cattle drover, who brought cattle overland to a property known as 'Langhorne's Station' during the 1840's. Frank Potts, travelling through the region, recognised the potential of the area and settled in 1850 on the ancient flood plain created by the Bremer and Angas Rivers.

He planted the first grapes in the district in the 1860's at the now heritage listed 'Bleasdale Winery'. Today there are close to 6,500 hectares planted with vines. From those pioneering days, Langhorne Creek's envied soils and climate have attracted many famous names and a new generation of 21st Century winemakers.

Langhorne Creek is situated in a beautiful corner of the world – near Lake Alexandrina and the stunning south coast of South Australia.
